

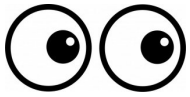


Overfields Technology Survey

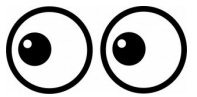

This year our Harvest Festival celebrations in school will be a little different as we sadly can't meet for a whole school assembly.

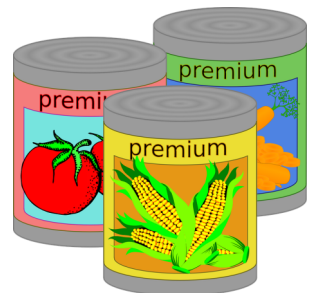
