Listen to the brilliant story below all about bodies.

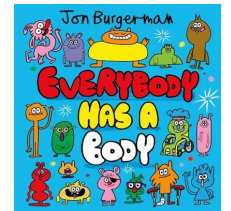
Can you make your own characters like Jon Burgerman?
