I would like you to write your own short, sharp sentences that will make people think about ways to ‘reduce, reuse and recycle’ rubbish and protect our world. **Spelling**—This weeks challenge is to recycle the letters in ‘reduce, reuse and recycle’ to make as many words as you can. See how many words you can make using only these letters. What is the longest word you can make?

You need to structure your ideas using a Title, Numbered points/Bullet points, Imperative verbs (bossy verbs), Chronological order, Diagrams and Short sentences. Send them to me then I can have a go at making your fantastic upcycling idea!

**Maths**—Keep learning your multiplication tables. This week I would like you to recycle numbers to make 50 number sentences where the answer is always 50. You can use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division but the answer always has to be 50!

e.g.  $100-50=50$   $25 \times 2=50$   $250 \div 5=50$   $30+10+5+2+2+1=50$
