Maths


This week I would like you to practise 1 more/1 less

Your grown up will then ask you to predict 'guess' how many there will be if you take one out or add one more. You can then count together to check.

This week I would like you to practise the tall ladder letters. Remember to start on the 'l' and don't move on to the next letter until you can form it correctly



This week you could use paint and have fun finger painting them. If you don't have finger paint you could use shaving foam, custard or anything else you can find in your home. I can't wait to see what you use!
