Butterfly Symmetry Paintings

MATERIALS: Paper, Scissors, paint, Small pots, Spoons

Step 1: Cut paper butterflies First, you'll want to cut your paper into a symmetrical butterfly shape. Fold your paper in half, then use the scissors to cut out a half butterfly, with the body along the fold. Open.

Step 2: Prepare paint Pour small amounts of paint into pots and add a spoon to each pot.

Step 3: Add Paint to Paper Use the spoon to add drops of paint to one side of your butterfly paper.

Step 4: Fold Paper Fold the other half of the paper over the paint drops to create a paint sandwich. Press and rub with your hands.

Step 5: Open the Butterfly Painting Finally, open the paper to reveal your symmetrical



butterfly painting!
