two



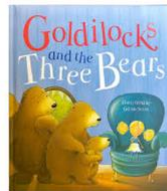
Number 2 is like a swan,

three

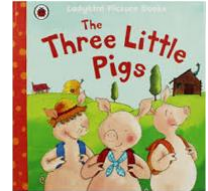


Number 3 is a butterfly's wing,
Visiting flowers in the spring.

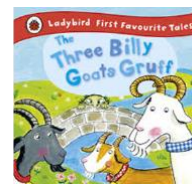
Since we are thinking about writing numbers to 3 there are lots of stories that focus on 3. Here are some of my favourites:

I hope you enjoyed listening to these stories. Here are some activities for you to try

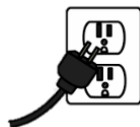
- Help your grown up make some porridge. What will you put on yours? I like banana and honey!

To help Mrs Desantis achieve the 'Green Flag Award' I would like you to:

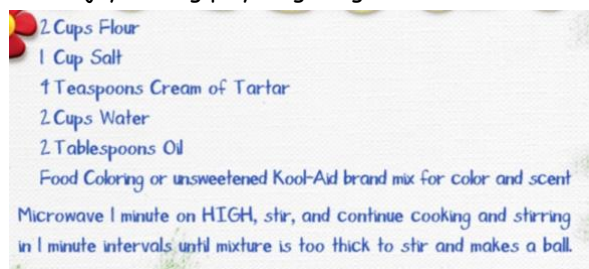
