

This week in school we will be looking at number doubling.



You will need to make a ladybird shape and something to use for the spots (buttons work well but you could use anything - carboard circles would be good)

Start by putting 1 spot on each side. How many are there altogether - 2. Say double 1 is 2. Repeat the above with 2, 3, 4, 5 spots.

Once you've practised this several times ask what is double 2, 4, 1, 3, 5? They can use the ladybird and spots to help.
