Play buried treasure on Phonics Play. Select phase 5 and revise all.

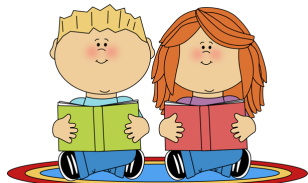
Also— the 'ie' and 'ow' graphemes can make more than one sound. Have a go at Cheeky Chimps on Phonics play with these sounds.

You have listened to stories over the last few weeks. Remember to keep reading books yourself too.

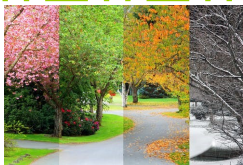
Follow the link and read Owl Babies to a member of your family. Have a look on the 'Book Trust' website too for some more books to read along with.

Choose your favourite animal or illustration in the story and draw it/paint it/make it.

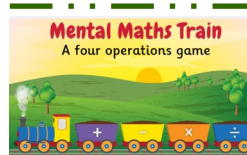

Subtraction—

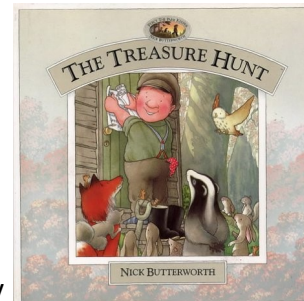
Use a number line to 20 to help you with the train game below. Select the subtraction sign and then 'up to 20'.
