You will have now received information about our new approach to recording home reading using the Marvellous Me app/ This has been introduced from Reception to Year 6 (excluding the



Language unit) and we hope that it makes things easier for parents to note when their child has read. It will also free up some of our teaching assistants valuable time so that they can support more directly in the classrooms. If you have any questions or problems with using the Marvellous Me app please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

Class emails are now up and running and are an effective way of contacting your class teacher. Teachers check their class emails every day, and since COVID, they have been an effective and quick way to make contact. However please do not expect teachers to reply after 5.00pm at night when they will go home to their own families. Any emails after this time will be dealt with the following day. You will find a reminder of class email addresses overleaf.

Mrs Dales, a teaching assistant at Overfields Primary, has added to her role this year by supporting school with attendance and punctuality. She now has the added job title of Pastoral Support Assistant. If a child is not in school, and she is unable to make contact by phone, then she may come to the house to check on the reason for absence as part of our safeguarding procedures. She will also be able to offer families help with contacts with other professionals including Early Help and the School Nurse.

If pupils fail to attend a club then the place will be offered to another child as we often have waiting lists. Unfortunately we do not have the capacity for every child to attend every club they would like to and oversubscribed clubs will have names pulled from a hat.
