Review and Reflection of the 5 key indicators from DfF 2021-2022

Key achievements to date until July 2022:

New equipment purchased and used within the curriculum to improve quality of lessons. This investment in equipment that will last for years so that children in future cohorts will benefit from good quality equipment and engaging activities.

CompletePE online scheme of work purchased to support the teaching of PE from EYF to Y6. All teaching staff has access. The Curriculum map is bespoke to our school and all the resources to teach the units are in one place. It is a teaching sequence with activities that will support the teachers ensure our children achieve the expected outcomes for their age. The planning is structured and includes clear progression of skills, key questions and videos to support good PE teaching for each year group.

CPD- Staff have attended courses provided by Sports Partnership and have gained valuable skills and knowledge

We have provided a wide variety of extracurricular School Sports Clubs these have included Street Dancing, Multi Sports, Football, Tri Golf Tag Rugby and Change4Life with great attendance
